#### One in five Kansas children is living in poverty - Is this the road we want to travel?

In this year's KIDS COUNT Data Book, Kansas' national ranking for overall child well-being sank to 19th in the nation, reflecting the negative impact the recession has had on our state's children. Last year, Kansas ranked 13th,



Kansas also dropped from 18<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> place nationwide in percentage of children living in poverty. The Data Book reported that 18 percent of Kansas kids are living in poverty that's more than 121,000 children.

Reducing child poverty is one of five "measurable goals" that Gov. Sam Brownback has said that he will pursue as part of his "Roadmap for Kansas." If the governor and policymakers are serious about reducing child poverty, they must protect crucial supports for children like nutrition, early childhood education and college savings so they can grow up healthy and prosperous. 
